A Diabetic Wellness Fair was held at the Geneseo United Methodist Church, home of the Geneseo Parish Outreach Center, on November 5th from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. There were 64 in attendance including 24 participants, 13 vendors and 27+ volunteers. The participants represented a variety of ethnicities.

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GPOC Executive Director's Report October 2022

Clinics – The Center has continued to provide weekly, and sometimes semiweekly, medical clinics. There are four active medical providers who share coverage. We provide one evening clinic monthly, with the other clinics on Tuesday, Thursday or Friday mornings. Of note is that we have served a few Ukrainian refugee families needing US entry physical examinations and TB screenings.

Grants – We continue to search for possible grant opportunities to supplement our funds for out of county residents. A Mary Clark Thompson Grant for \$2500 has been spent for those out- of-county



residents with diabetes. Dental, prescription and medical specialty costs are our primary foci of service to our patients. The 2021-2022 CSBG funds were expended by mid-summer. Our new fiscal year started October 1. Therefore, we again have funds to support Livingston County residents at or below 200% of poverty.

Diabetic Health Fair – Linda Weaver spearheaded the preparation for this event taking place Saturday, November 4. Her hard work and dedication are truly appreciated.

My report is abbreviated this month due to my absence. I appreciate all our volunteers who faithfully serve every week to keep the Parish Outreach Center functioning efficiently and compassionately for our patients.

GPOC earns an NAFC 2022 Gold Rating



The National Association of Free & Charitable Clinics (NAFC) Quality Standards Program. We earned this rating by attesting that we have certain policies and procedures in place to provide quality care for our patients.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Another opportunity for serving is to assist our clients with prescription expenses. In March alone we experienced a 500% increase in prescription-assisted expenses.

Listed below are the costs of four of the many drugs our clients need.

- Lantus, a long-acting insulin commonly used to treat diabetes: 1 box of 5 pens is \$340. There are 308 units per pen, so depending on the dose the patient requires. A patient may be using 30 units per day on the low side to 100 units per day on the high side.
- Trulicity, a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: Trulicity 1 box is \$771.
- **Symbicort,** combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: 1 inhaler is \$263 for the generic.
- **Spiriva,** an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: Spiriva Respinat is \$150 for 1 inhaler.

Medication costs vs living expenses: If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision could worsen their condition and could increase the likelihood of more emergency room visits and hospital stays

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

GPOC Emergency Food Pantry

Between September 2021-September 2022, the Food Pantry served 661 families, which included 1,387 individuals! In the months of January – September 2022, the Food Pantry served 403 families, including 960 individuals. That's 91 more families and 314 more individuals than in the same time period last year or a whopping 22% increase in families and a 46% increase in individuals!!

The Geneseo Parish Outreach Center, Inc., has also seen a marked increase in visits with 554 office visits in the past year. These numbers are expected to continue to increase. The numbers really drive home the need for the services provided by the GPOC and its Emergency Food Pantry in our community and the surrounding areas.
