\$30,000 Excellus Blues Award

The Geneseo Parish Outreach Center has been recognized by Excellus BlueCross BlueShield for its commitment to addressing health disparities and improving health equity and has been named a 2023 Health Equity Innovation Awards recipient. The awards program aims to provide financial support to community programs that address racial and ethnic health disparities across Excellus BCB's upstate New York service area.

This \$30,000 award is especially beneficial because of its broad parameters. The Center will now be able to reach beyond Livingston County to help those not covered by other types of grants. Director Donna Flaherty is thankful and honored that the Center is one of the award recipients: "This funding will be used to help provide access to dental care and medication to the underserved throughout Livingston and surrounding counties."

provide services to those who live in and out of Livingston County. The year ended on particularly high notes when we were awarded the Excellus BlueCross BlueShield Health Equity Innovation Grant, and our Annual Appeal was our most successful ever. We have a couple of large insurance payments due in early 2024 that are not paid for by our grants, so we are still monitoring cash flow; however, the financial outlook for 2024 is bright.

Executive Director's Annual Report January 2024

Clinic highlights – Medical clinics are held every Tuesday morning with Dr. Stewart. There are also monthly Thursday clinics staffed by N. Bailey, PA-C. On occasion, the Executive Director will fill in for medical staff when needed. We provide care for several immigrants/refugees as well as for members of the Amish community.

In October we held our first Migrant Worker clinic at the Leicester Migrant Center in coordination with the Archdiocese of Rochester Migrant Outreach. Since that time, we have been treating those patients at the Parish Outreach Center and referring them for other services such as

dental. Our thanks to K. Galliford for her efforts in making this liaison possible.

Grants- We are well situated financially for this fiscal year, thanks to the efforts of many volunteers who researched grant funding and applied. Our biggest issue with several grant awards is the implementation and data processing to track funding for reporting purposes.

- **The CSBG** Grant increased to \$48,500 yearly for the next three years, federal funding permitting. •
- We have received a \$1,500 grant from the Mary Clark Thompson Foundation for out-of-county . diabetic patients. These funds have been utilized as of December 2023.
- United Way Grant of the Monroe County and GLOW Region is still offering only \$28,500 for this fiscal • year. It is our hope that we can receive a higher grant allocation in the next cycle.
- United Way of The Southern Tier. We have requested \$25K for this grant to serve Steuben and • Chemung County residents for 2024. The decision will be announced in May 2024.
- FLPPS/CRFP Grant. The Finger Lakes Performing Provider system has \$12M for IT enablement for • partners that serve Medicaid patients. We received computers from this grant. Jerry and Scott have been working diligently to smoothly transfer our computers to three new laptops and one PC.
- Excellus Grant: K. Galliford applied for this \$30,000 grant, which we received as of November • 2023. This grant can be applied to medical expenses for out-of-county residents.

Bilingual Assets: Nadine Bailey, PA-C, and administrative volunteer Xiomara Rivera speak Spanish and can help accommodate our Hispanic patients.

Volunteer needs – As always, we have volunteers aging out, snow-birding to warmer climates in the winter, and attrition for other reasons. It is our hope that we can recruit younger potential volunteers to fill the gap. I have been the Executive Director since 2017. At some point, there will need to be a smooth transition that allows an incoming Executive Director to take the reins. I project that this will occur within the next five years. A Five- Year Plan is essential.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Medications: If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision could worsen their condition and could increase the likelihood of more emergency room visits and hospital stays.

Listed below are some of the drugs most-needed and the cost of each 30-day supply:

Lantus, (insulin) commonly used to treat diabetes: \$35 (federal cap)

Trulicity, a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: Trulicity 1 box is \$853.

Symbicort, combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: 1 inhaler is \$263 for the generic.

Spiriva, an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: Spiriva Respinat is \$150 for 1 inhaler.

Ozempic (injectable for diabetes): \$940

Eliquis (blood thinner): \$579

Xarelto (blood thinner): \$529

Trelegy (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$640

Breo Ellipta (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$277
