Food Pantry Faces Challenges
As food insecurity continues to rise,
the Food Pantry strives to serve an



increasing number of clients, especially over the summer when children are home. Pam Klingman and others who deal with the administration of this valuable service, also wrestle with the complex and sometimes confusing procedures and paperwork involved. In April the Klingmans attended the Foodlink annual mandatory meeting, which Pam described as "eye-opening. Food demand is greater and food sources are decreasing."

As always, the Pantry welcomes all donations, including non-food items such as laundry soap, cleaning products and personal care items.

<u>Calling for Computer-Savvy</u> <u>Data Entry Volunteers</u>

As the GPOC continues to transition from paper charts to electronic medical records, our volunteer staff will soon be instructed in further in-house computer training. This enhanced training will enable the staff to utilize additional computer functions, e.g., appointment scheduling and referral tracking, reducing the dependence on paper files.

This transition will require additional staff. We are looking for volunteers who have data entry/computer skills, preferably with a medical background, who can commit to 2-3 hours a week.

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Executive Director's Report July 2024

Clinic highlights – Weekly clinics. In the first 6 months of 2024 we saw 159 patients compared to 111 in the first 6 months of 2023. CSBG – 87(2024), 71(2023); United Way - 53 (2024), 55(2023); Excellus – 27(2024), 8(2023); Out of County – 27(2024), 15(2023).

Grants- We have a new grant writer, Karen Ferguson.

UW of the Southern Tier. We have been awarded \$7,250 from the United Way of the Southern Tier. We will be receiving portions of this grant throughout the year. These funds are allocated for Steuben and Chemung County residents.

The CSBG Grant of 48K has almost been fully spent. Our next allotment will begin at the beginning of the next fiscal year on October 1.

We have received \$1,500 from the **Mary Clark Thompson Foundation** for out-of-county patients in the F. F. Thompson service area with chronic medical conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, and cardiovascular disease.

We have applied for \$40,000 from **United Way of the Monroe County and GLOW Region**. This application is for a five-year cycle. It is our hope that we can receive a higher grant allocation, since this grant will cover not only Livingston County residents for the first time, but also Monroe, Genesee, Ontario, Wayne and Wyoming County residents. We should hear within the next month. **(See below**)**

Excellus Grant Blue Cross Blue Shield Health Equity Innovation Grant for \$30,000 is also almost fully spent. In May, members of our staff and a willing patient appeared in a TV press conference of this grant award. This grant can be applied to medical expenses for out of county residents.

Sun Life Dental Grant. Kirsten Galliford has applied for this grant of \$50K to cover dental expenses, which have been our greatest financial expenditure and need. We should be hearing by end of July whether we are awarded.

Morris Solar Ridge Community Project Grant. We have applied for \$10K and should hear this summer.

Volunteer needs – As always, we have volunteers aging out, snow birding to warmer climates in the winter, and attrition for other reasons. We continue to search for nurses and paraprofessionals that can assist us with clinics and day to day operations. Data entry and analysis are identified needs.

Five-Year Plan. Our committee consists of K. Galliford, M. Slater, L. Weaver, and D. Flaherty. We have been transitioning from paper charts to electronic records. We will still have to maintain paper charts for CSBG audits, but all medical information, including referrals, medical summaries from other practices, laboratory and diagnostic imaging results and correspondence can be found in Amazing Charts EMR. We have also expanded our data entry using the EMR to capture statistics on grant fund recipients, point of care, insurance and employment status and chronic disease.

*Due to the high volume of applications and limited funds, United Way will not be funding the GPOC for 2024-2025. This loss of \$40,000 will have a major impact on the services we will be able to provide. We will continue to seek other sources of income, including grant opportunities. Please contact GPOC with any suggestions.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Medications: If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision could worsen their condition and could increase the likelihood of more emergency room visits and hospital stays.

Listed below are some of the drugs most-needed and the cost of each 30-day

Lantus, (insulin) commonly used to treat diabetes: \$35 (federal cap)

Trulicity, a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: Trulicity 1 box is \$853.

Symbicort, combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: 1 inhaler is \$263 for the generic.

Spiriva, an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: Spiriva Respinat is \$150 for 1 inhaler.

Ozempic (injectable for diabetes): \$940

Eliquis (blood thinner): \$579

Xarelto (blood thinner): \$529

Trelegy (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$640

Breo Ellipta (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$277

If you or your organization can support shelf items and/or medications, please respond to the GPOC ASAP with your wishes.

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2.GPOC was Incorporated on October 7, 2004.

3. Non profit (503C) status was granted on November 5, 2005.

4.Linda Weaver, one of GPOC's founders, was the first Executive Director from (2004-2017).

5. The first newsletter was published in December 2019.

6.In 2019 GPOC partnered with Foodlink to become an emergency food pantry.

7.GPOC can provide food regardless of borders.

8.GPOC's first use of social media was on March 31, 2019.

9. There have been 3 fundraiser walks.

10.Donna Flaherty, RPAC, became the second GPOC Executive Director in July 2017. She serves in this capacity to this day.

11.Two pharmacists have volunteered with GPOC. In 2015, a pharmacist started managing the dispensary and helping patients with the cost of medications.

12.In 20 years, there have been 57 Board of Directors members.

13.On average, Board Members serve 4.5 years. The longest term has been 17 years. The shortest 1 year.

14. There have been 168 volunteers.

15. There have been 28 medical providers.

16. There have been 55 nurses.

17. There have been 83 non-medical volunteers.

18.In May of 2008, GPOC was awarded the TRIAD Community Service Award and was recognized by the New York State Assembly.

19.In 2023 GPOC was awarded gold member status through the National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics.

20.In 2023 GPOC partnered with the Rochester Diocese and the Tepeyac Migrant Center to help our local migrant community.
