This year's Appeal Letter will emphasize what makes GPOC special as well as the sobering outlook for 2025-2026.

- First, we are an ***all-volunteer staff***. None of our funding is used to compensate the local volunteers who donate their time and talent to helping others.
- Did you know that we have ***no borders***? Our organization has Geneseo in our name because that is where we are based. We have actually helped patients in 11 western New York counties. How can we help people outside of Livingston County?
- We take a ***holistic approach*** to helping others. We treat the whole person. If there is a need for food, we have an emergency food Pantry. Because we partner with Foodlink, we do not restrict based on residency. If someone has a need for eye care, dental care, mental health services, or diagnostic testing, we have partnerships with local providers to make the care possible and more accessible.
- Our ***funding is taking a significant hit*** based on federal changes and rising costs. ***Please see the Grant section of the Executive Director's Report on page 4***. The needs of our community are increasing, as well.

Angela Ellis: Another Super-Professional at GPOC

After 30 years of service to Livingston County and a not-quite-retired status, Angela Ellis has agreed to help with the ultra-important task of grant writing for the Outreach Center. Her expertise could not come at a better time as GPOC faces potential financial challenges.

A native New Yorker, Angela earned a BA in political science from Gannon University in PA and a Master of Urban and Regional Planning from the University of Pittsburgh. She also completed certifications at the Grantsmanship Training Center in 2000 and Strategic Performance Management at Rutgers University in 2017.

Angela is among those featured in *Women's Biographical Review: Achievers, Leaders, & Role Models*, a publication of Livingston County. Most recently she served as the County's Deputy County Administrator for Planning and Special Projects. Ontario and Wyoming counties have also benefited from her gifts. She supervised several projects in Ontario from 2001-2008 and was Interim Director for Planning in Wyoming.

Although she has retired from official public service, Angela has started her own consulting business and does some contract work for Livingston County. She has been involved in community service through Rotary, Boy Scouts, Livingston CARES, and the Livingston County Land Bank Corporation, for which she was the first Executive Director and founding member. She is also a member of the Geneseo United Methodist Church, where she was wisely recruited to lend her talents to GPOC. She and her husband Mark have two adult sons and are also busy with the family farm in Cattaraugus County.

Executive Director Report

July 2025

Statistics – Since 1/1/2025 we have assisted 162 patients (2024 same timeframe – 168)

No insurance – 57; Amish – 24; Hispanic/Latino 20; Black/AA – 13; Migrant/Migrant worker – 17

Homeless- 6; Unemployed – 53; Disabled – 44; Retired – 33; Chronic Condition – 110; CSBG - 89

Physicals – 67 (employment – 17; School – 4) Total Referrals- 70 (Dental Referrals- 49; Vision Referrals – 9; Specialty Referrals – 8); Medical Bills – 53; Prescription Coverage – 63

County numbers: Livingston -118; Monroe – 10; Steuben – 6; Wyoming – 11; Ontario; 3; Allegany – 1; Genesee – 3; Cattaraugus – 1

GRANTS – We have heard from the Golisano Foundation, The Mother Cabrini Foundation and the Upper NY Conference United Women of Faith. All have denied our requests for grant funding this year. Karen Ferguson and Angela Ellis have been researching grant opportunities for the Center.

The United Way of the Southern Tier has renewed our grant for this year for a sum of \$5609.61. The St. Luke the Evangelist Church family has donated \$1500. The Geneseo Kiwanis Club gave the Center \$2000. Excellus Grant is \$7500. CSBG Grant funds of \$48,500 for 2024-25 has been spent. We are not anticipating any more grant funding from CSBG in 2025/26. United Way of MGLOW region is \$21,370 through December 2025. We anticipate a reduction to \$14,250 in January of 2026.

Volunteers – We are still looking for paraprofessional volunteers that can staff the Center on a weekly basis. Anyone who knows of a potential volunteer, please contact the Director.

Paperless Charting – Volunteers are being trained to schedule patients in the EMR. We will be scanning all HIPAA signed forms and RHIO forms into EMR. We will be reviewing our financial tracking system with Melissa Slater, Treasurer, to streamline that system.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Medications: *If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision could worsen their condition and could increase the likelihood of more emergency room visits and hospital stays.*

Listed below are some of the drugs most-needed and the cost of each 30-day

Lantus, (insulin) commonly used to treat diabetes: \$35 (federal cap)

Trulicity, a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: Trulicity 1 box is \$950.

Symbicort, combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: 1 inhaler is \$204 for the generic.

Spiriva, an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: Spiriva Respimat is \$512 for 1 inhaler.

Ozempic (injectable for diabetes): \$499

Eliquis (blood thinner): \$599

Xarelto (blood thinner): \$579

Trelegy (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$656

Breo Ellipta (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$232 (now generic)
